



BMC YMG Organisational Report – Quarter 3 NOVEMBER 2024

1. YMG Activities

- We held our Quarterly General Meeting virtually on the 26th July. We have not held a
 physical General meeting in 2024. We aim to hold the final meeting on the 30th November
 physically.
- We held our annual retreat at Heron Bridge on the 2 4 August.

2. Secretariat

2.1 Membership

- As of 14 November 2024, we had a total number of 50 fully subscribed members.
- Out of the annual fee paid by BMC members, a large portion is paid to Fourways Circuit, and the balance of the funds contributes towards other organization expenses.
- We had two full YMG members transfer into BMC in Quarter 3 Brother Ntsepe and Ndlovu.
- The following five brothers **Nathi Tyembile**, **Paul Monthlabaki**, **Sandile Shadrack**, **Ayasanga Besman** and **Sihlangule Siwisa** are on-trial currently.
- The following seven brothers were robed on 2nd November Lukhanyo Tshele, Mancoba Ndlumbini, Thabiso Mavuso, Dumile Ndzeku, Asiphesona Cetywayo, Lwazi Nkolonzi and Maida Zebulon Mogoai.

2.2 Life of members

- Our members continue to give generously to their church and organisation. A testament to the numerous times we have asked them to contribute. For Rhone the YMG raised R50K.

2.3 Manyano Meetings

- We continue to hold our Manyano meetings every Sunday.
- On Sunday 11 August, we hosted the FWC Bible Study and Revival. The theme of the Bible Study was Saved by Blood and was led by Bro Siyabonga Gama. 3. Financial Report Membership Update

- As an additional fundraising tool, cash reserves have been deposited into an interestbearing account at 7% per annum.
- The International Women's Day Gala Dinner (IWDGD) fundraising event generated a net positive income this year.
- The proceeds from the IWDGD have been <u>fully</u> expended towards the acquisition of uniforms for 37 learners from Little Roses Early Childhood Centre as part of our social upliftment initiatives.
- An additional amount was raised during the awareness and fundraising drive leading up
 to the Little Roses Early Childhood Centre Outreach Day. A portion of this amount was
 spent on meals and refreshments for the outreach. Additional expenditure was incurred
 on the purchasing of printing paper and toilet paper that was donated to the centre.
- The net proceeds from the above fundraising drive were allocated towards the expenses for the second outreach initiative at Impilo Child Protection and Adoption Services.
- In this financial year, a substantial amount has been contributed towards our sister organizations' initiatives as per the following breakdown.

- Under the banner of evangelism, we spent a substantial amount towards the renovations and refurbishment of the Lanseria Preaching Place.
- Financial support amounting to **R8,650.00** towards the Men's Retreat costs was provided to five members.
- To fulfil the objective of 'developing members socio-economically', a care voucher was given to a fellow member due to their elderly status.
- A fellow brother sadly lost a parent in September. A representative on behalf of BMC YMG Exco. attended the funeral in the Eastern Cape and the organisation contributed R3,000.00 in total towards transport costs and *Umkulukutwano* in accordance with the financial policy.
- YMG contributed a total of R50,000.00 towards Rhona during the organisational Rhona drive in October. A direct deposit of R42,700.00 was paid into the church's bank account on 27 October 2024. The balance of contributions amounting to R7,300.00 was paid by YMG members who opted to or mistakenly made payments into the church's bank account.
- BMC YMG hosted the FWC YMG Quarterly Meeting on 5 October and incurred **R3,060.00** in catering costs.
- To fulfill the socio-economic objective as mandated by the YMG constitution, BMC YMG organised and hosted the inaugural Men's Masterclass on 8 & 9 November. Total expenses incurred for this event amounted to R12,449.79, largely for Venue Hire (Hospitality & AV Team) and Catering costs.
- Old Mutual has promised <u>partial</u> financial support towards the catering costs based on the number of delegates that attended the Men's Masterclass event. The funds from Old Mutual had not been received at the time of writing this report.
- Two tickets at a price of R475.00 each were sold via Webtickets for the Men's Masterclass event, and the remainder of the tickets were converted into complimentary tickets.
- Ticket sales income from Webtickets of R900.00 (excl. Webtickets fees) for the Men's Masterclass event was deposited into the BMC YMG bank account on 14 November 2024.

4. DDSR Office

4.1. EDUCATION

• We held our inaugural men's masterclass on the 8th & 9th November. This function was open to men only, and served as an empowerment session for men. Various speakers gave talk on Men's Health – both physically and mentally. Financial empowerment was covered and so was leadership – business and family.
